Look carefully and focus on the detail

It takes time and thought to arrange your garden space. Properly arranged light spots not only emphasize the proportions of plants, but also reflect the true beauty of green elements. A very good idea is to illuminate them from the bottom to underscore the attractive form of flowers and bushes.



If you like minimalistic forms, you can choose e.g. the <u>Hue Lily</u> post which will enable you to highlight even the smallest detail of the garden, presenting the plants in any color you want. Meanwhile, the <u>Hue Turaco</u> posts are great for enthusiasts of geometric shapes, emphasizing the charm of outdoor space and lighting e.g. the path leading to the front door of the house.

When choosing garden lighting, you should consider not only the design of the lamp, but also its specifications, such as weather resistance. Therefore it is so important to use light luminaires with a high IP rating which represents their resistance to moisture and dust. The minimum rating for garden lamps should be IP 44. When choosing lighting e.g. for a pond, select models with an IP 67, or even an IP 68 rating. Garden lighting should be made of highest quality materials that are resistant to changing weather, such as aluminum and stainless steel. Therefore, to enjoy durable lighting, which will serve you for many years, choose only proven manufacturers.

The right lighting in the right place

Do not forget to properly illuminate the facade of the house, too. A discreet lighting will not only emphasize the architecture, but also provide the family members with a sense of security and allow them to move freely around the house after dark. A few light spots are all it takes to subtly accentuate the walls and the color of the building. If you prefer traditional-looking models, choose Robin and Creek families which perfectly complement rustic-style buildings. They are based on classic designs, but also equipped with LED technology. Minimalistic and elegant models, such as <u>Cistus</u> and <u>Trowel</u>, are ideal for modern elevations. A perfect solution to illuminate the most frequently used spaces, such as the front door or driveway, are sconces, which can be automatically activated via GPS to welcome the family members.
